The Society is holding the 2021 annual convention in Akron, Ohio at the Holiday Inn Akron West. For Thursday evening, Friday evening and Saturday there is an excellent program of presentations. On Thursday evening, Ray Lichty who started his long railroad career on the B&O Railroad Akron Division as a bridge tender, tower operator, dispatcher and chief dispatcher will talk about his experiences and the Division's operations as a tower operator and dispatcher from the perspective of those positions. On Friday, Dave Ori will discuss operations at Akron Junction and on Saturday, Mike Cole will present a history of the CT&V. Three excellent railroad photographers, Dave Beach, Roger Durfee and John Parker will present their photographs and knowledge of the operations and facilities on the Akron Division and the CI&W. On Friday, there will be a bus tour of railroad and industrial facilities, a Saturday evening banquet and a Sunday activity where members will use personal transportation to attend. The convention schedule, registration form and hotel reservation information will be sent out in both a later mailing and email.

The Society decided to hold the convention because of the progress of vaccinations and the reduction in total cases and serious hospitalizations.
